ABSENTEE VOTING:

1. Voter Registration office
2. By Mail (Must call or come in office and request application)

WHO IS ELIGIBLE TO VOTE ABSENTEE:

- Students, their spouses and dependents residing with them.
- Armed forces, Merchant Marines, their spouses and dependents residing with them
- Persons serving with the American Red Cross or with the U.S.O. who are attached to and serving with the Armed Forces of the U.S.A. their spouses and dependents living with them.
- Employment, obligations to be absent from their county on Election Day during the hours the polls are open.
- Persons with physical disabilities.
- Governmental employees, their spouses, and dependents residing with them, who are out of their county on Election Day.
- Death in family, or attending funeral within three-day period before the election.
- Persons on vacation on Election Day.
- Poll managers, certified poll watchers, county voter registration board members, and county election commission members and staff working on Election Day.
- Overseas citizens.
- Persons attending sick or physically disabled persons.
- Persons serving as jurors in state or federal court on Election Day.
- Persons admitted to hospitals as emergency patients on the day of an election or within a four-day period before the election.
- Person sixty-five years of age or older.
- Persons confined to a jail or pre-trial facility pending disposition of arrest or trial.

ELECTIONS:

Primary Elections-----Second Tuesday in June of every even numbered year.
General Election-----First Tuesday in November every even numbered year.
Special Elections and Municipal Elections held when ordered.
