I. Call to Order

Vice Chairman Lucas made a Motion to add to the CCTC Agenda, Tanglewood Road, 2nd by Councilman Oliphant, Council vote was unanimous.

II. New Business

1. Approval of CCTC Minutes of January 7, 2008

Councilman Jordan requested that the minutes from the minutes of January 7, 2008 reflect that the Master Plan for the Exit 65 Interchange was proposed by Regan & Bogan. Clerk to Council will make noted change in minutes.

Councilman Branham made a Motion to approve the CCTC Minutes of January 7, 2008, 2nd by Vice Chairman Lucas, CCTC vote was unanimous.

III. Old Business

1. One Way In/One Way Out Road

Councilman Oliphant asked for an update on One Way In/One Way Out Road.

Mr. L.B. Cannon of the Dennis Corporation stated the proposed change

1 regarding these roads would be to block off One Way In and widen One Way
2 Out but this would be a costly project. **Vice Chairman Lucas** asked if this was
3 a public road and Mr. Cannon replied that it was. **Councilman Oliphant** said the
4 main problem is a safety issue. **Councilman Oliphant** then said the ideal thing
5 to do would be to keep it a dirt road and the safety issue. Mr. Cannon said that
6 water pipes would need to be put in and also there may be some unmarked graves
7 they may uncover and that would be a very expensive proposition. **Councilman**
8 **Jordan** asked about signs and Mr. Cannon had spoken with SCDOT and said they
9 were ordered but not in yet. **Councilman Oliphant** then said he would like more
10 information at the next CCTC meeting and just wanted to make this a safer situation.

11 2. Saluda Street Sidewalks

12 **Councilman Oliphant** stated that the sidewalks on Saluda St. needed to be repaired
13 and hoped to find some grant monies to extend the sidewalks to the by-pass.

14 3. Lancaster Street Sidewalks

15 **Councilman Oliphant** said the same problems existed with the Lancaster St.
16 sidewalks, he would also like repairs made and also extended to the by-pass.
17 Mr. Cannon said the City of Chester has put in for a Grant to repair sidewalks and
18 Mr. Cannon had asked that the sidewalks on Lancaster St. be extended to the
19 by-pass and that the City was receptive to the idea. **Councilman Oliphant** asked
20 Mr. Cannon to continue to pursue SCDOT for monies to repair the sidewalks and
21 Mr. Cannon said he would.

22 4. Langley Road Update

23 **Councilman Oliphant** asked **Mr. L.B. Cannon** for an update on Langley Road.
24 Mr. Cannon said the survey had been completed and also that Crystal Creek Rd.
25 should be included because of the 28-30 homes that were located there. **Councilman**
26 **Oliphant** asked if the County would need for the property owners to deed the road
27 Over to the County and the County Attorney replied that they did and also that we
28 would need the petition the residents had submitted. **Chairman Roddey** asked Mr.
29 Vernon Sigmon, a resident of Langley Rd, if he had a copy of the petition and he
30 replied he did. **Chairman Roddey** then said he would get a copy of the petition and
31 get it to the attorney.

32 5. Hopps Road

33 Mr. Cannon suggested that Council add Looking Glass, Reflection and Rippling Brook
34 to the list also. Mr. Cannon stated that this subdivision had been built by Mr. Daves
35 and it was his suggestion that he talk with Mr. Daves and ask him to do a little upgrading.
36 Mr. Cannon said that guardrails on Hopps Rd. would cost approximately \$50,000 and
37 that actually the roadway serves as a dam and there would be liability if it was taken

1 Into the county system. **Councilman Oliphant** suggested that the county could go to the
2 first dam and stop and said that of course, if that portion was taken in we would need to
3 be careful of the liability.

4 6. Cedar Grove Lane

5 **Councilwoman Guy** asked for a report on Cedar Grove Lane. Mr. Cannon said it was
6 a SCDOT road and that they were redoing their roadway evaluation but the County could
7 ask them to put it on their list.

8 7. Hunter Rd.

9 **Vice Chairman Lucas** said this road from Hwy. 99 to Hwy. 901 was in terrible shape and
10 would like for it to be paved. Mr. Cannon replied that it too was a SCDOT road and
11 would ask them to consider it.

12 8. Tanglewood Rd. – Added on Agenda

13 **Vice Chairman Lucas** stated this road was put in the system about 1983 and it is gravel
14 and tar and is in awful condition. Mr. Cannon said he thought this was also a SCDOT
15 road and but would check.

16 **Councilman Oliphant** then asked if Council could get an update on C-Fund monies by
17 the next CCTC Meeting.

18 At this time Mr. Cannon introduced Mr. Herb Cooper and Ms. Julie Barker from SCDOT.
19 Mr. Cooper is over the C-Fund allocations and Ms. Barker is the liaison for Chester
20 County and Mr. Cooper said he had only been in this capacity a short period of time
21 But if the County needed any help to please call.

23 **Vice Chairman Lucas made a Motion to adjourn the CCTC Meeting, 2nd by**
24 **Councilman Martin, Chester County Transportation Committee vote was**
25 **unanimous.** Time was approximately 6:05pm
