3. Application of Solv-Polymer on roads off Armory Rd.

**LB Cannon, Dennis Corporation** updated CCTC members that the price of 90 cents/sq. yard was still good and the 5 roads previously discussed: Looking Glass, Rippling Brook, Reflection, Nancy and Hopps plus an extension off of Hopps would cost \$24,045. **Councilman Oliphant** asked if this would save the County money and Mr. Cannon said the County would not have to work those roads for at least a year. **Councilman Oliphant** then said he had his driveway done with the Solv-Polymer and he had about 50-75 tractor trailer trucks in there every day and it was holding up well. **Councilman Martin** asked why couldn't the County come in with a tailgate spreader and Mr. Cannon replied that the County did not own a tailgate spreader. **Councilman Branham then made a Motion to approve the application of the Solv Polymer on the above roads, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Councilman Jordan.** Discussion: **Vice Chairman Lucas** asked Mr. Cannon to check to see if SCDOT had a tailgate spreader. **CCTC then voted and the vote was unanimous.**

4. Cost to pave driveway aprons with asphalt

**LB Cannon, Dennis Corporation** said he had been requested to get estimates on paving driveway aprons and the lowest bid from three different contractors was \$500 and there were between 35 and 45 driveway aprons. **Councilman Oliphant** asked why couldn't we do soil and cement and Mr. Cannon said it was more time consuming and **Councilman Oliphant** said it would probably be less costly. **Councilman Branham** asked roughly how many feet were we talking about and Mr. Cannon said about 12-15 feet per driveway. Mr. Cannon then suggested to the CCTC members that we wait until he could get lower bids. **Councilman Martin then made a Motion to accept this as information, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Councilman Branham, CCTC vote was unanimous.**

5. Update on Roadway Improvement Program

**LB Cannon, Dennis Corporation** told CCTC members that the Roadway Improvement Program should be completed by the end of September.

**Councilman Oliphant made a Motion to adjourn, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Councilman Branham, CCTC vote was unanimous.** Time was approximately 5:50pm
