34 1. Approval of CCTC Minutes of September 17, 2007

35 **Councilman Branham made a Motion to approve the CCTC Minutes of September**  
36 **17, 2007, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Vice Chairman Lucas, Council vote 5-1 to approve with Council-**  
37 **woman Guy voting to abstain.**

38 2. Transportation Enhancement Grant Application/Hwy. 9 Master Plan

39 **Councilman Jordan** stated that a Master Plan created by Regan and Bogan for the Exit  
40 65 included lighting and a pedestrian crossing and that if we applied for a Transportation  
41 Enhancement Grant we could received up to \$200,000 with a 20% match and use “in  
42 kind labor”. **Councilman Jordan** stated either solar or electric could be used.

1 **Councilman Branham** then said that part of his district is in the area and he has been  
2 involved with the Greater Richburg Association and that this was, in his opinion, a great  
3 idea. **Councilman Oliphant** stated he was not opposed at all to the concept of the  
4 project but would also like information from Duke Energy on electric lights. **Councilman**  
5 **Jordan** played a CD from a news station in Charlotte showing poor lighting on I-277 and  
6 the portions where solar lighting had been installed were better. The newscast stated  
7 that solar lighting was more cost effective. **Councilman Oliphant** stated he would still  
8 like to see a proposal from Duke Energy. **Councilman Branham** said CCTC could look  
9 at both proposals. **Councilman Jordan** stated that he just wanted to get approval to  
10 apply for the Grant and that would give time for them to get proposals on electric lighting.  
11 **Chairman Roddey** stated that lighting needed to be installed. **Councilman Martin** said  
12 that solar lighting was very expensive. **Vice Chairman Lucas** asked what we would do if  
13 we were denied the Grant and **Councilman Oliphant** stated this would be the first step  
14 in the process, to complete it first then wait and see.

15 **Councilman Jordan made a Motion to apply for a Transportation Enhancement**  
16 **Grant /Hwy. 9 Master Plan and if accepted, earmark for lighting and crosswalks,**  
17 **2<sup>nd</sup> by Councilman Branham who also stated he would like to co-sponsor this**  
18 **motion, Council vote was unanimous.**

19 **Councilman Oliphant** stated it would be a good idea to apply for this grant every time  
20 they could.

23 1. Acceptance of Raxter Road into County System

24 **Chairman Roddey** stated that it had been looked into extensively as to when Raxter  
25 Road was taken into the County System and it could not be found and that a FEMA  
26 Grant had been applied for to start working on this road and CCTC needed to accept  
27 this road into the system officially.

28 **Councilman Oliphant made a Motion to accept Raxter Road into the County**  
29 **System, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Councilman Jordan, Council vote was unanimous.**

31 **Chairman Roddey** asked if there was any further business. **Councilman Oliphant**  
32 asked if he could have "One Way In and One Way Out, Saluda and Lancaster  
33 Street Sidewalks and a status report from the Dennis Corporation on where we  
34 stand on Langley Road and Hopps Road on the next CCTC Agenda. **Councilwoman**  
35 **Guy** asked if Cedar Grove Lane could also be added. **Chairman Roddey** stated that

1 would be OK. With no further CCTC business to discuss, **Vice Chairman Lucas made a Motion**  
2 **to adjourn the CCTC Meeting, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Councilman Branham, Chester County Transportation**  
3 **Committee vote was unanimous.**
