 Vice Chairman Lucas made a Motion to approve the Chester County Council Meeting
 Minutes of April 4, 2011, 2nd by Council Member Guy, Council vote was unanimous.

IV. Citizens Comments

Melinda Cole – 3694 Fishing Creek Rd., Rock Hill has asthma and has had it all her life. Breathing cold air brings it on and since moving to Rock Hill it has gotten better. She sited one day in February it was nice outside and she started wheezing and she suspected it was the sludge. She then sited an incident in Ohio and asked Council to take action.

Liz Odum – 1235 Gruen Augen Rd., Chester said she enjoyed photography and there were new flags at the Gateway Commons Park she wanted to photograph. On April 11 she and her husband went there and were stopped by two deputies and were told there was a private county event being held there. The next day she called Planning and Zoning and asked if a CO had been issued and was told no. She stated it was the second function that had been held there and that she also suspected that Economic

Development had already moved in. She stated that 64.4% of county citizens were on food Stamps.

Jimmy Bruce – Richburg – stated this was the second reading for Richburg Fire Bond and that \$1.4M was originally approved. He asked if Council bought land why did the county spend tax dollars to improve what is not County property. He also cited that the county was paying more for smaller tracts of land than for larger tracts. He mentioned the poor condition of the courthouse but stated that the county had purchased the Norse Auto Mall and stated it seems that the County keeps spending and he was concerned about putting a burden on the tax payers.

Nathan Peachey came before Council and asked if there were any questions concerning his purchase of land from the county.
