IV. Citizens Comments

Mr. Alfonzo Wherry, 2344 Southfork Rd., Rock Hill, SC came before Council to discuss several items. The first item was public safety in Chester County when violet thunderstorms occur. He stated the storms were becoming more severe and wanted to make sure Chester County citizens would be warned well ahead of time. The second item was the road he lived on, Southfork, he stated the trucks running up and down the road and he felt that the road could not handle that amount of traffic (Southfork is a State Road). The last item was the sludge being applied in his area and ask what could the County do about this.

10. Update on turkey feathers

County Attorney Winters had researched Vice Chairman Lucas's request concerning the littering of turkey feathers on the side of the roadways and determined that the County could not legally do anything to prevent this. Vice Chairman Lucas then stated he would like for the County to write letters to the carriers to contain the turkeys with a mesh wire so that the feathers would not litter the highways. Council Member Jordan reiterated what the County Attorney had stated saying that writing letters was fine but he did not believe there was anything the County could do legally. Council Member Branham agreed. Vice Chairman Lucas said he still wanted a letter written.

Chairman Roddey stated that if this is what Vice Chairman Lucas wanted he should put it in the form of a Motion. Vice Chairman Lucas then made a Motion that letters be sent to the carriers to contain the turkey feathers with a mesh wire, 2nd by Council Member Guy, Council vote was 3-3 with Council Members Oliphant, Jordan and Branham opposing, Council Members Lucas, Guy and Holcombe in favor, Chairman Roddey broke the tie in favor and said he would have the County Attorney send letters to the carriers.

VIII. New Business

Council Member Branham made the Motion to award the Paving Contract to Boggs
Construction in the amount of \$295,499 to pave Doe, Fawn, Snelgrove, Antler,
Murdock Rd. and Murdock Rd., Spur, 2nd by Council Member Jordan, Council vote
was unanimous. (Full Dept Reclamation)

Council Member Holcombe made the Motion to award the Asphalt Paving Contract of One Way In and One Way Out in the amount of \$260,110 to Boggs Construction, 2nd by Council Member Guy, Council vote was unanimous.

2. Transfer Cost of Sign material from C-Fund Account to Litter Control Account, \$2,998.96
<u>Vice Chairman Lucas made the Motion to transfer \$2,998.96 from the C-Fund Account to the Recycle & Litter Control Account, 2nd by Council Member Branham,
<u>Council vote was unanimous.</u> Council Member Branham then asked if the \$500 reward was still in place for anyone caught stealing signs and Chairman Roddey stated it was.</u>

IX. Council Members Comments

Chairman Roddey said he had a comment to make to Mr. Wherry who spoke under Citizens Comments. **Chairman Roddey** stated he had met with the EMA Director, Eddie Murphy and that we had sirens donated by Duke Power Company and that we were working on a plan to strategically locate them throughout the County, however, most of the sirens did need some work done to them.
