26	Fore Front in Chester County." Council Member Oliphant asked if this money would come
27	through Council or just go into "a checkbook". Ms. Parker said she felt that the County would
28	set up a line item budget for this money. Council Member Jordan asked how the 5% was
29	determined. Ms. Parker said she had talked with Attorney Edward Kluiters, Haynsworth
30	Sinkler Boyd and he thought this amount was adequate. Council Member Jordan then
31	asked if this was new projects or existing projects and Ms. Parker said if someone new goes to
32	a park then it would start. Council Member Oliphant then said if we could do this every year
33	this would get the process started. Chairman Roddey then said when we had Economic
34	Development with the Chamber we didn't have anything so we put a mileage on it. There were
35	no further questions or discussions, therefore, <b>Council Member Branham made a Motion for</b>
36	Economic Development to delegate 5% of monies from the Multi County Park
37	Agreements starting January 1, 2009, 2 <sup>nd</sup> by Council Member Oliphant, Council vote was
