Ordinance is still in our Ordinance Codification and he would like to see the County Attorney

the YMCA and Council Member Jordan replied yes and that there were also several other
boards that worked separately. Council Member Jordan then made a Motion to request
that County Attorney Winters rewrite the Recreation Ordinance to establish an Advisory
Committee for planning recreation for the future in Chester County and also this be considered
First Reading of the Ordinance, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Council Member Oliphant, Council vote was unanimous.

#### 4. Clean up of Eureka Mill

County Attorney Winters said a few weeks ago a gentleman had come before Council to request that he be allowed to enter the Eureka Mill property and remove some shelving. Since that time, it has come to the attention that the gentleman, in fact, did not own the shelving he requested he be allowed to remove and the property owners, Mr. Gary Mahaffey and his son Ken Mahaffey had met with County Attorney Winters and had two requests. 1) they remove two trailers filled with trash that they are paying storage on and; 2) that they understand the issue with the Performance Bond but would ask that Council consider splitting incrementally each time work was done. County Attorney Winters stated that she explained to Mr. Mahaffey that she needed a timeline with a dollar figure attached. Council Member Branham then asked which part of the clean up they would start with. Mr. Ken Mahaffey said what they had proposed was to get containers to clean up outside as they were cleaning up inside. Council Member Oliphant asked about the inside and Mr. Ken Mahaffey said the last people in there had left everything. Council Member Oliphant then asked if they had abated the asbestos and Mr. Mahaffey said they had started. Council Member Branham asked if they planned to tear down the existing building at the same time and Mr. Mahaffey stated they plan to do it piece by piece. Council Member Oliphant then asked about the bonding by stages and Mr. Mahaffey said taking the trash off as we demolish, which was about \$150,000. Council Member Oliphant then asked Mr. Mack Paul, Planning and Zoning Director if he had looked at the two dumpsters and Mr. Paul said he had not. Council Member Oliphant said he did not have concerns about taking the debris off but to did have concerns of letting someone go in and take the steel out without the Performance Bond and stated that if the past is a sign of the future then we could create something worse and we've all seen this time and time again. Mr. Mahaffey said he had had weekly conversations with Mr. Paul about this. Council Member Oliphant then said if the outside was cleaned and Mr. Paul would monitor this; Mr. Mahaffey asked what specifics do you propose and Council Member Oliphant stated to get the outside cleaned up. Chairman Roddey then proposed a committee to give Council some guidelines and the committee would consist of Council Members Oliphant and Branham, Mack Paul and County Attorney Winters. There was some other conversation regarding the Performance Bond and Chairman Roddey stated he was appointing this committee because we all want this mill taken down. At this time, Council Member Oliphant then made a Motion to allow Mr. Mahaffey to remove the two dumpsters, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Council Member Branham, Council vote was unanimous. Chairman Roddey asked that the people he appointed to the committee meet and come back to Council with some guidelines.
