2	2000 to require Article 5-600 Sexually Oriented Businesses in General Commercial as a
3	Special Exception listed as # 4 in the General Commercial District Regulations.
4 5	Mr. Mack Paul, Planning and Zoning Director explained to Council that in the past Chester
6	County has permitted use of sexually oriented businesses in General Commercial, but this
7	change will have anyone wanting to open up this type of business to have to go before the
8	Zoning Board and ask for a Special Exception.
9	Council Member Guy made a Motion to approve 1st Reading of Planning
10	Commission Recommendations on Text Amendment #CCMT09-0003, 2 nd by Council
11 12	Member Jordan.
13	Discussion: Council Member Oliphant then said that legally you couldn't "rezone anyone out"
14	but we'd have to have a place these places are allowed. County Attorney Winters then said
15	SOB's (Sexually Oriented Businesses) are protected under the 1st Amendment and that we would
16	have to be very careful. She said she would check this out before the next meeting because this
17	may be challenged. Mr. Paul then said "so some of the verbiage may need to be changed" and
18	County Attorney Winters replied "yes". Council Member Jordan said he had a concern with
19	General Commercial going into Residential areas because we had done this before and would
20	suggest new verbiage from the County Attorney. Council Member Oliphant asked if Council
21	could change the verbiage at this meeting and County Attorney Winters replied "no" but they
22	could make recommendations to go back to the Planning Commission. Vice Chairman Lucas
23	suggested they do that and County Supervisor asked if they could approve as 1st Reading with
24	the suggestion that it go back to the Planning Commission and County Attorney Winters replied
25	they could if Council Member Jordan withdrew his 2 nd and Council Member Guy her Motion
