# V. Public Hearing

#### Chairman Roddey opened the Public Hearing on:

 The issuance by the Issuer from time to time of one or more series of its Economic Development Revenue Bonds (the "Bonds") in an aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$10,000,000, the proceeds of which will be made available to the Institute for Business and Home Safety, an Illinois nonprofit corporation and an organization described in Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Borrower"). The proceeds of the Bonds will be used by the Borrower to defray the costs of acquiring, constructing and equipping a state-of-theart, multi-peril applied research and training laboratory to be located at 5721 Richburg Road, Richburg, South Carolina (the "Project"). The Borrower will be the initial owner and operator of the Project. The Borrower will unconditionally covenant to make payments sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on the Bonds. The Bonds will be payable by the Issuer solely and exclusively out of payments to be made by the Borrower and are to be secured, inter alia, by a security interest in the revenues derived by the Issuer from the Borrower in connection with the Project. The Bonds do not constitute an indebtedness of the State of, the County, or any other political subdivision of the State of South Carolina within the meaning of any state constitutional provision or statutory limitation or constitute or give rise to any pecuniary liability of such entities South Carolina, the Issuer or a charge against the general credit or taxing powers of any such entity.
