# A RESOLUTION TO AUTHORIZE THE COUNTY OF CHESTER, BY CHESTER COUNTY COUNCIL, TO SELL CERTAIN VEHICLES OF THE COUNTY AND THE SHERIFF'S OFFICE IDENTIFIED HEREIN UPON SUCH TERMS AND CONDITIONS AS DESCRIBED

WHEREAS, S.C. Code §4-9-30(2) authorizes the Chester County Council to *sell or otherwise dispose of real and personal* property, and

WHEREAS, S.C. Code §4-9-130(6) requires an ordinance and a public hearing only for the sale of real property, and

WHEREAS, Chester County and the Chester County Sheriff's Office have vehicles owned by the County that, while are still viable vehicles, need to be replaced by newer, more efficient vehicles and equipment, and

WHEREAS, Chester County Council has determined that it is in the best interest of the County and the citizens of Chester County to sell or trade these vehicles and equipment in exchange for newer models.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL FOR CHESTER COUNTY, SOUTH CAROLINA, DULY ASSEMBLED THAT THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION IS HEREBY ADOPTED:

Re: Rural Fire Vehicle Consideration

2002 Ford F-250

Chairman Stuart and Council Members,

Over the past several months, the above referenced Fire Coordinators Office Response vehicle has broken down multiple times. During the Carolina Poly fire, which was a multi-day incident, the vehicle was unable to be used to haul the necessary foam and equipment due to misfiring and stalling. We had to tie up an EMA vehicle to accomplish the tasks which should have been performed by this office. The truck was taken to the shop with bad spark plugs and coils. Two days later, the vehicle again broke down at the scene of a serious motor vehicle accident and was subsequently taken to the county maintenance shop. The maintenance shop diagnosed the problems as a bad head, timing chains, and piston issues. The estimated cost for the above repairs would be \$3500-5000. Due to the truck being over 18 years old and having over 21\$,000 miles, it would be cost-prohibitive to spend money repairing it. We also have a 1995 Chevy S-10 pickup truck with is not suitable for daily use to do condition.

Our office responds to all major fires, car accidents, Hazmat, and fire investigations within the county during the day as well as hauling supplies, performing maintenance on other county equipment, and conducting fire inspections in county businesses. Our response is not limited to Monday through Friday 9-5 as we are on call 24 hours a day, seven days a week, 365 days a year. We also attend multiple classes and training outside the county to keep out staff up to date on training and fire service issues throughout the state. This office has requested replacement vehicles in the past four budget year requests, which were ultimately denied. The county motor pool is a temporary solution, but there are no vehicles there that meet the basic needs of jobs we need to perform. Not having the appropriate vehicles to perform our jobs adequately is seriously hindering the mission of the Chester County Fire Coordinators Office and the Rural Fire Commission.

We are requesting replacement vehicles that can haul supplies, storing investigative and inspections tools, spare equipment for the county fire departments, and the swift water rescue gear we will need. We also need vehicles that are 4-wheel drive, due to the changing terrain within the county and can safely tow the fire safety trailer and any other county assets. Your consideration in this matter is greatly appreciated.

We look forward to working together to be able to properly serve the fire departments and citizens of Chester County in a safe and efficient manner.
