- 1. Chester County Council Meeting Minutes of April 19, 2010

<u>Council Member Guy made a Motion to approve the Chester County</u> <u>Council Meeting Minutes of April 19, 2010, 2nd by Council Member Holcombe,</u> <u>Council vote was unanimous.</u>

Chairman Roddey stated that two items from the previous CCTC Meeting needed to be added to the agenda because a vote was taken. The first Item would be the Solar Lighting Project at Exit 65. <u>Council Member Branham made a Motion to add</u> <u>the Solar Lighting Project at Exit 65 to the agenda, 2nd by Council Member Jordan,</u> <u>Council vote was unanimous.</u> Chairman Roddey said the next item to add would the the Hydrology Study for the Richburg Fire Dept. and Fire Dept. on 901. <u>Council Member</u> <u>Guy made the Motion to add the Hydrology Study to the agenda, 2nd by Council</u> <u>Member Jordan, Council vote was unanimous.</u>

V. Public Hearing

Chairman Roddey opened the Public Hearing on: An Ordinance to Create the Medical Responder Advisory Council There were no speakers, therefore, **Chairman Roddey** closed the Public Hearing.

VI. Ordinances

1. 3rd Reading of an Ordinance to Create the Medical Responder Advisory Council <u>Council Member Holcombe made a Motion to approve 3rd and Final Reading on An</u> <u>Ordinance to Create the Medical Responder Advisory Council, 2nd by Council</u> <u>Member Branham, Council vote was unanimous.</u>

VII. Old Business

- 1. From CCTC
 - a. Reimbursement for Road Sign Material \$3,638.65

<u>Council Member Oliphant made a Motion to approve reimbursement for</u> <u>road sign material in the amount of \$3,638.65 from C-Funds, 2nd by Council</u> <u>Member Guy, Council vote was unanimous.</u>

b. Main Street, Chester, SC

<u>Council Member Oliphant made a Motion to approve \$65,000 for the Main</u> <u>Street Project in the City of Chester from C-Funds, 2nd by Council Member</u> <u>Jordan, Council vote was unanimous.</u>

c. Solar Lighting Project

Council Member Branham made a Motion for the Dennis Corporation to handle the Solar Lighting Project at Exit 65 and funding would come from the C-Funds, 2nd by Council Member Jordan, Council vote was unanimous.

d. Hydrology Study

<u>Council Member Jordan made a Motion for the Dennis Corporation</u> <u>to handle the Hydrology Study at 901 and Richburg Fire Dept new station in the</u> <u>amount of \$9,800 and funding would come from the C-Funds, 2nd by Council</u> <u>Member Branham, Council vote was unanimous.</u>

2. Eureka Mill

Attorney Tom Hall thanked Council for allowing him to be on the agenda. Mr. Hall stated he was there on behalf of his client Larry Ramsey. He gave an update of what has transpired up to this date and stated that all his client wanted was to start back to work. Basically, Mr. Hall said as he sees it, his client needs to (1) provide an original letter of credit, (2) have proper permits from DHEC (3) present a plan to Council and **Mr. Paul**, (4) get application permits from Planning and Zoning. Mr. Hall stated that Mr. Ramsey has been in this business for over 30 years and did not do some things properly but he can have this project completed in 3 months if allowed. Mr. Hall stated that the goal for the County is a clean property and for his client to get approval and move forward. County Attorney Winters stated that she never received an original letter of credit, DHEC permits had expired and the reference she checked could not give her the name of the company that he was VP of. **Council** Member Oliphant stated that with everything that has happened, Council should have stayed with the original ordinance. His concern was the debris and whether Mr. Ramsey had disposed of it properly. Council Member Oliphant said the performance bond was in the ordinance for a reason and that a lot of what was in the building of value is no longer there and nothing is going to the landfill. Mr. Hall then said it was important that Council did approve a letter of credit and that no one has said it's not valid and that it was not important whose name was on it as long as the County was the benefactor, he said he just could not see a problem and urged Council to look at the positives and not negatives. Council Member Oliphant said "what about the debris" and Mr. Hall said \$50,000 would take care of that. After further discussion with Mr. Ramsey, Mr. Hall, County Attorney Winters and Council Members, Chairman Roddey then said "get us a letter of credit with Mr. Ramsey's name on it, DHEC permits (get a trust account) and start getting the application for permit for Planning and Zoning and after you get these, come back and see me", in the meantime, we will take this as information only.

3. Sale of Property to York Tec

Economic Director, Karlisa Parker came before Council to request permission to sell to York Tech, 4.120 acres of land that was recently purchased from the Frazier Family for \$85,000. <u>Chairman Roddey made the Motion to approve the sale of 4.120</u> <u>acres to York Tech, 2nd by Council Member Branham, Council vote was unanimous</u>.

3-3.107 Accessory Structure

- a. No accessory structure or building shall be constructed prior to construction of the principal building on the lot. Buildings intended to serve as accessory structures constructed prior to the principal building shall be considered the principal building and shall meet all applicable district and building code regulations. (Exception: Property classified as Agriculture Use in the Tax Assessor's.)
- b. Accessory structures shall be located in the rear or sides of the principal building and shall meet accessory yard setbacks and applicable district regulations.
- c. Manufactured or Mobile homes cannot be used as accessory units.
- d. Accessory buildings shall occupy the same lot as the principal building unless indentified as agriculture use.
