V. Public Hearing

Chairman Roddey opened the Public Hearing on:

1. An Ordinance to Amend Chester County Code by Adding Sections 14-31

through 14-50 to Chapter 14, Businesses

Before anyone spoke, **Mr. Tommy Darby, Treasurer** and **Mr. Mack Paul** presented a presentation showing the approximate cost of a license based on several gross amount figures and the category of businesses they would fall under. **Mr. Paul** also stated that no farmers would fall into the business license ordinance but there were many businesses in Chester County that the County knew nothing about.

Speakers for the Public Hearing:

Mr. Jeff Wilson, Lowrys Hwy. stated he ran a diverse cotton farm and felt the proposal needed to be thoroughly investigated. He said the neighboring counties did not have a business License and his farm employed several people. Mr. Wilson also said the fee based on the gross amount was "very scary" and asked that Council not approve the Ordinance.

Mr. Jeb Wilson, Wilson Rd. stated that only 8 other counties were doing a license and he felt an alternative would be a business registration fee instead.

Mr. Rusty Darby, Darby Rd. stated he was asking Council to totally vote this ordinance down, not postpone. Mr. Darby stated the fees would take a large amount of his profit and he would need to hire an additional person to keep up with this and cause an additional accounting fee.
Mr. William Stephenson also asked Council not approve the ordinance. Mr. Stephenson said he would have to go up on his fees to his customers at his barber shop.

2. 3rd Reading of an Ordinance to Amend Chester County Code by Adding Sections 14-31 through 14-50 to Chapter 14, Businesses

Council Member Jordan made a motion to postpone 3rd Reading to give Council time to digest the amended Business License Ordinance they had just received, 2nd by Council Member Guy.

Discussion: Vice Chairman Branham and Council Member Holcombe both said they needed all the facts before they voted and Council Member Holcombe stated he thought it was another tax burden. Council Member Guy suggested a workshop. County Attorney Winters reminded Council that a time frame needed to made in the Motion or the Ordinance would die. <u>Council Member Guy withdrew her second and Council Member Jordan his</u> <u>Motion. Council Member Jordan then made the Motion to postpone 3rd and Final</u> <u>Reading until August 19th on the Business License Ordinance, 2nd by Council Member</u> <u>Guy, Council vote was 5-1 to approve with Council Member Oliphant opposing.</u>

1. Questions and Concerns re: Sheriff's Dept.

Lieutenant Thomasson stated that at the last Council Meeting Major Marsh stated that last year 400 Speeding tickets were written and that many were wrote last month. The Highway Patrol had asked for their help and they were assisting the Highway Patrol. Mr. Thomasson also said he knew there had been complaints but the Sheriff's Department was trying to keep the County safe. Council Member Oliphant asked what was the basic amount for a ticket and what percentage came to the County. Mr. Thomasson stated an average ticket is \$81.50 and Mr.Darby (County Treasurer) stated 40% comes to the County. Major Marsh then stated that the department has a problem with DUI cases because there is only one good working camera and many cases get thrown out of court and also that normally a ticket is not written unless someone is going 15 miles over the speed limit except in school zones and they have zero tolerance for speeders in a school zone.. Council thanked them for the great job they were doing.
