EVICTION OF TRESPASSER PROCESS (NOTICE TO QUIT)

You have allowed a person to live within your residence or on the property that you own, lease, or rent and you wish for this person to leave, but he/she will not.

- 1. You can visit the Magistrates Office or our website to get an application for Notice to Quit.
 - A \$65.00 dollar application is required, per individual you wish to evict.
- 2. After filing with the magistrate's office, the claim will be served on the defendant and has FIVE days in which to satisfy your claim or move from your property.
- 3. After the FIVE days, if the tenant has not moved, you may file for **a WRIT OF EJECTMENT**, which requires a \$10.00 service fee. The writ gives the tenant twenty-four hours before the process server takes the steps to begin the set-out process.
- 4. You can also stop the notice to quit process at any time prior to the set-out process, by sending a written notice to the magistrate's court.

Any GUEST living at the property for more than fourteen days in a six-month period or spending more than seven consecutively nights will be considered a tenant and a twenty-day written notice of eviction is required prior to filing with the magistrate's court.
