Summons & Compliant Process

You have a complaint where you are owed money or have paid for services that have not been completed and you would like to know what you can do:

Only claims valued at \$7,500 or less can be brought in Magistrate Court.

* NOTE: There is no assurance you will receive the money if you win the claim or if the judge finds in your favor*

<u>Option 1:</u> If the complaint is with a company that is classified as business; you must send a certified letter stating your complaint. You must give the other party twenty days to respond, if not, you may file a claim at the magistrate's office.

<u>Option 2:</u> If the complaint is with someone or a company that is classified as personal; you may contact them to let them know that you are going to take legal action. If you have no satisfaction, you may file a claim at the magistrate's office.

- 1. You may contact or visit the magistrate's office to begin a claim or to ask any questions that you may have. You will need to complete the SUMMONS & COMPLAINT APPLICATION, which has a filing fee of \$80.00 dollars.
- 2. It is required to have two copies for the filing process (one original and one copy).
- 3. Once served the defendant will have thirty days to answer your complaint. If an answer is filed, the court will schedule a hearing and notify you by mail.
- 4. After the thirty days if the defendant has not responded or satisfied your complaint, you may contact the magistrate's office to request a Judgment by Default if an itemization of account was filed.
