II. Pledge of Allegiance & Invocation

Chairman Stuart asked for a Motion to remove from the Agenda, Item IX – Appointment to Forfeited Land Commission, Vice Chairman Branham made the Motion to remove this item from the agenda, 2nd by Council Member Lucas, Council vote was unanimous.

At this time, <u>Vice Chairman Branham requested to Amend the Agenda to add under New Business</u>, a <u>Matching Grant request from Catawba Regional</u>, 2nd by Council <u>Member Holcombe</u>, Council vote was unanimous.

III. Approval of Minutes

1. Chester County Council Meeting of April 7, 2015

Council Member Lucas made a Motion to approve the Chester County Council Meeting minutes of April 7, 2015, 2nd by Council Member Guy, Council vote was unanimous.

IV. Citizen's Comments

Mr. Lee Johnson, 4036 Hayward Lane, Richburg, SC came before Council to speak on the budget. Mr. Johnson said he heard an employee was going to be hired for Economic Development and asked "where is the money coming from"?. His guess was "fee-in-lieu" fees and he said "taxes are fees" and that a pile of money had been funneled into Economic Development and that the employees needed raises, other departments had needs that should be addressed and Economic Development should "stand in line" like everyone else. Mr. Johnson also said each department head should evaluate who they really needed. He then said that Council should consider putting Citizen's Comments at the end of the meetings instead of at the beginning.

- 2. Catawba Farm and Food Coalition
 - Gloria Kellerhals and Ben Boyles came before Council to give an update on the Catawba Farm and Food Coalition. A slide presentation was shown and there were four basic points made; (1) Producer Education; (2) Consumer Education; (3) Agribusiness Development and (4) Planning, Partnership, Policy. After several questions, Council Member Oliphant asked Mrs. Kellerhals what would she need Council to do. Mrs. Kellerhals replied a Committee with members of Council and in particular, someone to serve as Chair. Council Member Oliphant said he would, Council Member Guy as well as Vice Chairman Branham and County Supervisor Stuart. Mrs. Kellerhals said she would be in touch and let them know when the first meeting was planned.
